All 3 members of the public here for the same reason which are their concerns about HGV's 45 ton vehicles accessing Mytum & Selby site up New Lane. Quite a few of them with very smelly loads. There was supposed to be a limit of 10 -12 a day, but now there as many as 20 a day up and down this road.

Residents feel they have not been consulted about these vehicles using a road which is not suitable for such heavy vehicles, which frequently mount the grass verges to pass one another, which is making the verges a real mess. Also the time of access has been changed (without any consultation with residents). It used to be from 8am but has now been changed to 7am and lorries start up and down by 6.30am.

Also one lorry came up New Lane on Saturday 17th May at 12.20pm as the Gala floats were gathering with a large amount of blue liquid spurting out of the back of the equipment on the load. This was a health & safety hazard with so many young children lining the streets awaiting the floats. They had to stop at the top because of the float wagons and the Head Teacher from the school had to pull children away from whatever it was coming out of this truck.

Residents state they already have subsidence because of mine working under their homes, surely these heavy vehicles are in danger of causing even more damage on already weakened areas?

Chairman agreed we would check with Selby regarding access limitations, hours of use and amount of lorries. Also we would write to Mytum & Selby asking for explanation of what exactly was coming out of the lorry on Saturday.

The Chairman thanked the residents for their attendance and bringing these matters to our attention.

The meeting closed at 7pm.
